From the Pastor's Desk

March 2023

As many of you know Maran and I recently went to Alaska for a week to see our son, Jonah, compete in his first sled dog race. That is a sentence I never imagined I would be writing when we brought Jonah to the baptismal font in January of 1999. Jonah one day hopes to participate in the 1160-mile Iditarod in Alaska and this 312-mile race we witnessed and helped with was his testing this dream out. The Iditarod reenacts and celebrates a musher whose team took the 1160-mile trek between Nome and Anchorage to deliver serum during a diphtheria outbreak. The John Beargrease race in Minnesota's arrowhead recalls a postman who delivered mail and packages along a 500-mile route. By the time you are reading this, the American Birkebeiner will be completed for this year. The Birkebeiner recalls two knights saving Prince Haakon during a period of civil unrest in Norway. The two knights strapped on skis made greaves for the arms and legs out of birch bark, and took the babe overland, over hill and dale through thick brush, to safety.

What all of these stories have in common is faithfulness. The heroism that is celebrated recollects not extreme acts of courage, but people who did good simply by fulfilling what they saw as their vows. A stubborn goodness if you will. It was not a violent bravery that history at times calls for but more of an insistent loyalty to the purpose that they had been called to. Postman lived by a simple creed: Neither snow nor rain nor heat nor gloom of night stays these couriers from the swift completion of their appointed rounds. How cool is that?! Basically, the creed says that whatever challenge comes their way the courier will strive to overcome it. The knights who saved Prince Haakon would have made a vow to protect the weak and innocent and the crown – invoking both God and human goodness in the hopes and dedication to be true to their vows. When tested those knights were faithful. The musher and the team celebrated in the Iditarod simply fulfilled what they thought was an ethical compulsion to care for the most vulnerable.

Think about all the things that happen every day simply because people are faithful. Faithful train engineers and truckers and warehouse workers and road maintainers and postmen and teachers and EMTs and doctors and nurses and servers and artists and musicians and spouses and and and..... Most of what we have that is good is because of a dynamic interplay between what God has given us and human faithfulness. Do we say thank you enough for the everyday faithfulness that allows so much good to happen? If everything good is a gift, but if we take the gift for granted, aren't we shutting ourselves from a great thing – gratitude? The pandemic disrupted things but also showed us how interconnected we are and how many things happened every day because of everyday faithfulness.

Wouldn't it be great and healthy if we lived in thankfulness for all of the simple acts of daily faithfulness that hold this whole show together?

Plant your seeds now and trust in the Lord that these seeds will bear fruit even when you are gone.






Confirmation

The cover girls have been busy making tie quilts, but that is not all we do.

Recently the cover girl members, Janet Rivard and Betty Beckman made 31 baby blankets and Maxine Poppe made 34 nursing covers for moms expecting a baby. The hospital clinic gives these covers to mothers who are taking their prenatal course. Again this year Carol Nelson and Maxine Poppe applied for the \$250 Thrivent grant to cover the material. We were able to buy enough material, thread, and buttons to make the covers and baby blankets. It was a fun project and great to help out in our community. Also thank you to all who are donating washable material and thread. We are always welcome to more help.

OUTREACH COMMITTEE

Each year we pick a charity to benefit from our special Lenten offerings which come through our 'coin folders.' The folders are actually designed for dollar bills, but are still called "coin folders". This year's beneficiary is Missionary Aviation Fellowship, which is an agency that serves the world's most isolated areas. Their mission statement is: "Help, Hope, and Healing" for the Isolated. This ministry serves missionaries and workers in some of the world's most geographically isolated areas: areas with terrain so inaccessible that customary transportation cannot serve them. Missionary Aviation Fellowship serves these areas and delivers post, medicine, education materials, and transportation in emergencies, that allows missionaries and other workers to do their good work.



Columbarium/Memorial Wall Update:

Work continues on the Memorial Wall and Columbarium. The first group of ordered wall plaques have arrived, and are very impressive. We will be putting in another order soon. The Columbarium fund has received funeral memorials, and money for brick work from the Memorial Endowment Committee, and money from the Church Council for landscaping. Columbarium niches continue to sell. If you have considered a columbarium as your final resting place, now is the time to make that thought a reality. Please continue to keep this project in your thoughts and prayers.



First Lutheran Community Park

Thanks to the generous support of many church members and community partners we have nearly reached our fundraising goal. We couldn't be more thrilled and grateful to our entire community for getting on board (fully) with this project - thank you!

The momentum, generosity, and excitement around this project has been nothing short of AMAZING. The "Task Team" has secured enough funding to purchase all the equipment and is currently working to secure the installation. Our goal is to secure an installation date for late April / early May and to have the full playground up and functional by this spring/summer. For that to happen we need to fill our funding gap of approximately \$15,000 to lock in an installation date, team, and materials as soon as possible.





Becky Iverson has been the organist at First Lutheran Church in Hayward for 28 years. On Sunday, January 22 she played her last notes for the congregation on the beloved Van Daalen organ.

She told the "Record", when interviewed, that she planned on playing "Prelude on Beautiful Savior," as her departing song. After the service, a cards and coffee celebration for her was at the church.

When asked if that was her favorite song, Iverson replied, "They're all my favorite songs."

Iverson seems destined to her music.

When she was growing up in Red Wing, Minnesota—her father a TV repairman and her mother a homemaker. Iverson said her parents got her a piano.

"We lived on the second story and to get upstairs you had to take outside steps. They hauled that piano up there for me. I was in third grade," she said.

Neither of her other siblings ever played. Iverson took eight years of piano lessons from Professor Laukandt, who taught at the Redwing Seminary. She sang and accompanied the choir on piano in high school during her time in Red Wing.

Shortly after high school, Becky married Alan Iverson. They had three children: Sharon, Scott and Susan.

Alan served in the US Army for two years and then the family moved to Mankato, Minnesota where Alan went back to school. Becky said one of the churches in town needed an organist—the Salem Lutheran Church.

"I played in the church balcony, and Al directed the choir," said Iverson.

Alan then graduated college and got his first teaching job in Albert Lea, Minnesota. The family moved there and Alan taught music at the high school.

While in Albert Lea, Becky took organ lessons from Professor of Music, Kim Kasling, who taught at St. John's University.

"He played the organ at the Basilica in downtown Saint Paul," Becky recalled, adding that she took lessons from him for at least 8-10 years.

While in Albert Lea, Becky said she played the pipe organ at Grace Lutheran Church.

Becky said she and Al had always talked about building a log home on a lake when they retired. They wanted to live in the Hayward area. "We must have spent 10-15 years planning the home," she said.

In 1995 their dream came true and they moved to Hayward and built their home on the Tiger Cat Flowage.

Becky first played piano at the Spider Lake Church in Hayward, but she heard that First Lutheran Church had a position open for Organist. She applied and got the position, along with being the Choir Director, too, at that time. Al sang in the choir, she said.

Asked what her favorite thing was about being the organist at First Lutheran, Becky said, "My life has been so good; I can't pick one thing. The people, the pastors—I've been so blessed. I know that. Everything is a God thing. It just happens. I don't have to do a thing. I am grateful that everything comes my way. It's always been a privilege to me to help people worship. I have to blame it on God."

Becky moved to Cambridge, Minnesota to be closer to her children. She plans on continuing to play the organ there.

"Day 1", a voice of mainline Christian Churches, presents messages by clergy representing mainline Christian faiths, including those of the ELCA. Peter Wallace, host for each broadcast, facilitates discussion with clergy on timely topics. This radio ministry reaches our shut-ins, visitors to the area, and others for whom regular worship and Church affiliation are not a part of their daily lives. The cost per broadcast is \$30.

We have First Lutheran members sponsor the "Day 1" weekly segments on radio station WRLS-FM (92.3). These segments air at 8:30am every Sunday. The sponsorship of a broadcast may be in honor of a person, or special occasion, or in memory of a loved one and is open to all.
