From the Pastor's Desk

You know that recently I was in Alaska. In Fairbanks, we took a history cruise that taught us the native, gold, and war history of the Fairbanks area. During the cruise, we saw some properties along the river. It was extremely interesting. Along the river, one could see a home that was one of the original log cabins. Next to it would be an ultra-modern metal and glass home made of pyramids, rectangles, and cones. Next looked like Sanford and Son hit hard times – the people owned several trucks and snowmobiles in various states of disrepair and lived in a tarp-reinforced camper trailer with old tires rip-rapping their shoreline. Then would be a huge, three-story log cabin with personal pitching and putting green. Comfortable money, poverty, obscene wealth, and conspicuous consumption, all coexist side by side. Aren't there any building codes? Aren't there any covenants? What about property values? Alaska is libertarian. That means it is conservative when it fits its purpose. And it is liberal when it fits its purpose. They are hard to nail down politically. The building code is this: if it gets you through the winter – fine. The covenant is this: I won't tell you what to do if you don't tell me what to do. And it works.

Why does it work? Simple really. They all simply accept it. I know it wouldn't fly at Lake Owen – but on Lake Owen the people who live there are accepting of a different reality. There are lots of ways of doing things, there are lots of ways of governing, and there is more than one way to skin the cat as they say, but what is the common denominator where there is peaceful coexistence is that there is a general agreement or acceptance that this is how we will live together.

Sometimes things work not because it is designed perfectly but simply because the people involved have decided that this is how they will make it work. It works because no one opposes it. No one in their right mind believes it is perfect – the parties involved just decide that it works good enough as long as no one messes with it.

That is true of so many things. If we decide to make it work – it works. If we decide it is not going to work – it doesn't. Living together is more of a function of attitude than it is of having a highly functioning system. People get along and work together mostly because they have decided to. Attitude.

We at First Lutheran offer an attitude to the community: grace and love. We gather because we have experienced the acceptance of God's love and we figure others would benefit from that acceptance too. And we do works of love, good works because we figure it is more effective than hate or self-righteous judgment. We are under no illusion that we are perfect here, that is why we confess in the middle of every service, we just figure that grace and love are a good way to be together.

When I become part of anything bigger than me I usually join because of the public attitude they show. I never check their governing documents. I usually become a part of it because of how well they function together for the greater good.

Naysayers and grumps abound, and sometimes they are prophetic and should be listened to, but sometimes they are just sticks in the mud, wet rags, squeaky wheels. Never underestimate the power of good people just deciding to make things work. Faith is an attitude.

Sunday. The sponsorship of a broadcast may be in honor of a person, or special occasion, or in memory of a loved one and is open to all.



The bell tower was dedicated at the annual meeting in January 1973. The freestanding structure was designed and constructed to house the church bell which originally hung in the steeple of the old church on the corner of 4th and Michigan.

Olaus Brathen paid his own expenses and traveled by train to select the bell from the McShane Bell Company of Baltimore, Maryland. The bell is a seamen's bell similar to those used on the coasts of Norway to help sailors get their bearings. It was cast of copper and tin, weighing fifteen hundred poinds and has a loud, clear tone that can be heard for miles.
