# **From the Pastor's Desk**

One of the funny things about being a pastor in my tradition is that scholarship is expected of me. I am expected to study. I have intentionally changed the signage in all my offices to PASTOR'S STUDY. So far I have arrived at work on April 1st every year and no one has crossed off the apostrophe and added a question mark. But, because I am expected to

study, in a passage that I have read innumerable times, I saw something I'd never seen before. At the beginning of GENESIS the first human, in Hebrew literally THE ADAM was alone and this was problematic. God felt that a little tweaking of creation was necessary (even God found it necessary to remodel) so THE HUMAN was put into a deep sleep and one side was made into male and the other into female. THE HUMAN awoke to astonishment and awe and wonder as here was an opposite that made him complete. And for many who have known the joy of human love that awe and wonder has never left us. Humans need community and God's solution was to give us our opposite. Let that sink in. I am under the influence of social media and its algorithms and such but social media tries to give me my community by finding people like me. I buy one retro bowling shirt and suddenly all sorts of pop-ups for more bowling peripheries show up as does a bunch of invitations to join like-minded groups. I am invited to be in contact with a bunch of people that think just like me. Because I guoted from the HITCHHIKER'S GUIDE TO THE GALAXY I am inundated with offers to be in think tanks that find British humor great so I can join the 42 CLUB and on reels I get offered MONTY PYTHON and BENNY HILL skits. Social media tries to figure out my likes and dislikes and tries to narrow my focus so I can find my tribe. Sociologists have stated that many people today have found online communities based on a complaint they have made. Their complaining leads the algorithm to introduce them to other like-minded complainers and before long we have a hate group.

When we hang around with only people who think like us suddenly our world becomes US vs. THEM. And THEM, they, are at best idiots and at worst heretics and traitorous. And then hating them becomes not wrong but necessary.

God's solution was to give us our opposite. Not a sycophantic echo chamber but a community of dynamic tension. In college, in a required class unique to Luther College that combined the classics, history, social science, religion, and English, the moral dilemma of what to do if an amniocentesis reveals that the pregnancy is a Down's Syndrome baby was laid out before us. The class separated into ABORT and KEEP and then presented their rationale. I was so sure of myself that I, I am embarrassed to admit, was nominated to be the spokesperson for the ABORT side. We made our presentations. A coed from the other side approached me. She was from the I am here to get married sorority and I am blessed with mom's looks and body and daddy's credit card and my brain is a vacuum and you are invisible to my tribe. She singled me out and said these words: "My brother is Down's Syndrome. All I know is that he is only capable of love. He loves me on my terrible days and loves me on my best days. My whole family was afraid to bring him home but now we consider him to be the greatest blessing ever. We feel we wouldn't know love if it wasn't for him. I think you're wrong." She was in every way my opposite. And she made me a better person. It has been my pleasure to work with many Down's Syndrome people over the years and because I was opened up to them being a blessing, by my opposite, I have experienced everything and more than the man-hunting trust fund princess told me. But not only was she a man-hunting trust fund princess, but she was loving, intelligent, passionate, and truthful.

How many times have we been made better people by our opposites? We need community, and the temptation to find refuge in a community of the like-minded is understandably powerful and magnetic. But God, early on, showed us that a strong community, a healthy community, is built by our opposites. How many times, if we are honest, has our world become larger and richer because we were engaged by our opposites? Makes me kinda think God was right.

# **First Foodies:**

# Chicken & Dumplings

6 C. water

1 small potato, scrubbed and diced

2 ribs celery, cut into 1/2" slices

2 frozen chicken thighs or breasts

1/3 C. milk

3 chicken bouillon cubes

1 small onion, diced

2 carrots, cut into 1/2" slices (or a dozen baby carrots)

1 C. Bisquick

Put the water and bouillon in a large saucepan on high heat. Add the vegetables as you get them cut. When the broth is boiling, drop in the chicken, cover the pan and turn down the heat to a slow boil. After an hour turn the chicken pieces over and cook for another half hour. Mix the Bisquick and milk, stirring 30 times, then drop onto the boiling soup. Cook, uncovered, for ten minutes. Cover and cook another ten.
