From the Pastor's Desk

As I held my 28-hour-old granddaughter I wondered what I have wondered before: Who'd do this? We know better. Animals are products of lust and overwhelming hormones and such; we are thinking creatures. Little Lyla, like every human baby, is so vulnerable. The human baby is the most vulnerable of all creatures with a big head and tiny limbs and unable to fend for itself for many years. And as physically vulnerable as Lyla is we who already love her, mom and dad, siblings, grandparents, aunts, and uncles, we are vulnerable because our hearts can be ripped right out of us if something were to happen to this precious bundle. Again, who'd do this?

God, that's who.

We celebrate the incarnation at Christmas. That is the in-the-flesh-ness of God. God who is omniscient (all-knowing) and omnipotent (all-powerful) and omnipresent (everywhere always at once) would, with all those cards to play, choose vulnerability.

That is what love is – to be vulnerable. It is in being vulnerable that we develop friendships and loves, it is the ultimate in vulnerable to marry and create a new life. It is, in short, vulnerability that makes us most alive. When we can most be devastated is when we are the most alive.

We are not creatures of lusts and hormones like the animal world. Nor are we logical processors, human computers using our vast intellect to arrive at pure logic. We are drawn into the world of emotions and vulnerability because it is there, not in completing quadratic equations, but in giving ourselves away to each other, that we are most alive.

Holding our little Lyla I was reminded again that the core of Christmas and all the buildup to it is that God chose vulnerability. God chose love. God didn't have to – being omniscient and omnipotent and eternal has its benefits – but God did. Amazing.

Columbarium/Memorial Wall Update:

The FLC Columbarium Committee has accepted delivery of the first of two columbarium structures in the Memorial Wall and Gardens area, and brick trim work will be completed in November. A number of memorial plaques have already been installed on the exterior wall of the Church, and the concrete walkways and footings are completed. We look forward to the eventual expansion and beautification of this new addition to our Church home.

The Committee now seeks to expand the sale of niches to our member families. We understand that the cost of \$2,900 (joint) or \$2,700 (single) for each niche is a significant expense, and we are searching for a new approach for those who wish to reserve a niche with a smaller upfront commitment, with the balance to follow at the time of passing. In this way, individuals create a plan for the perpetual care of their ashes within the bounds of their Church home. With a payment of \$1,000 upfront, a niche space will be guaranteed with the understanding that the estate would follow through on the niche purchase at the time of death of either or both parties.

This approach may appeal to those individuals and families who would prefer to keep financial resources intact during their lifetime; yet, they want to make their plans for interment clear to their family and executor. It should be noted that the \$1,000 deposit is non-refundable, the niche space will be held for up to three years from the date of death, and the \$1,000 deposit would be credited towards the then current niche price, which could be higher than the current level of \$2,900 (joint) and \$2,700 (single).

If this option is appealing to you, we encourage you to take the following steps:

- Discuss your plan with family and executor.
- Complete an application, available from the committee, for a niche reservation.
- Deposit \$1,000 with the Columbarium Committee to hold a niche space.

Depending upon individual circumstances, the option described above may be helpful to some of our Church families who are searching for the right planning solution to meet their needs. We would be happy to answer any questions that you may have, and we ask for your prayerful consideration of a space in the First Lutheran Church Columbarium.



Operation Christmas 2023

OPERATION CHRISTMAS 2023 is underway once again this year. First Lutheran Church along with United Methodist Church and Ascension Episcopal Church will be working together to help make a blessed Christmas for 210 families again this year. Each family will receive the following: a tote/basket filled with nonperishable food items like peanut butter, cereal, etc.; a holiday pie, fudge, a ham, a bag of potatoes and carrots, frozen hamburger, coupons for milk and eggs, and fresh fruit (apples, oranges, and bananas.). In addition, each child in the family is provided a gift. This is truly a blessed Christmas for those who receive these baskets.

We will still be providing cookies for shut-ins. Cookies can be dropped off at church on Sunday, December 17th. No nuts and please follow good hygiene practices.

We will begin taking telephone calls and completing request forms for food boxes November 20th and the last day to take requests is December 6th. Call center hours are 8:30 AM – 4:00 PM Monday through Friday. Call 715-634-2141. Distribution this year will again be curbside: Friday, December 15th, 10:00 AM – 6:00 PM and Saturday, December 16th, 10:00 AM – 3:00 PM.

Since we are able to purchase food through Feed My People at a much lower price, we are asking you to consider a monetary donation to be used to purchase the food items for the baskets.

The Operation Christmas Bulletin Board will be in the First Lutheran Church narthex. It will have red and green tree tags for the gifts for the children (\$15-\$20 each) through grade 12.

Please take the tags, purchase, and wrap the gifts, and tape the tags back on the gift. Alternatively, we will be happy to mail trees to anyone who wants to save a trip into town to pick them up – just call First Lutheran during call center operation hours and they will be sent to you. Monetary donations are always welcome (let us do your shopping for you). Gifts can then be placed in the designated box in the narthex. Because of size variation, clothes are not recommended. Gift cards are a great idea for teens.
