It is often that people will say something thinking they are wise while proving the opposite. Survival of the fittest is often cited in referring to a strong, unchanging creature. But that is a swing and a miss. Look at the cottontails and the snowshoe hares around us. The snowshoe hares around here are way down because they have lost their habitat, are suffering heavy predation, and they cannot adjust. Cottontails meanwhile have changed their dietary and nesting habits and migrated to where there are less predators. The cottontails adapted. Whitetail deer are amazingly adaptable creatures, much more than mule deer, and their numbers and range show it.

It is not survival of the fittest, snowshoe hares are very fit, it is survival of the most adaptable. Those who acknowledge changing realities and accommodate the changes necessary are the ones who make it. 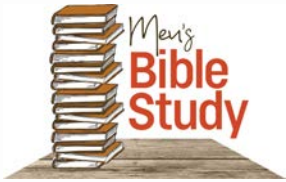
