# From the Pastor's Desk

# **March 2024**

Mark Twain is one of my favorite writers, his blending of wit, subtlety, his appreciation of irony, and his overt humor are unmatched. Humorists are keen observers of human behavior and Twain once stated: "Travel is fatal to prejudice, bigotry, and narrow-mindedness, and many of our people need it sorely on these accounts. Broad, wholesome, charitable views of men and things cannot be acquired by vegetating in one little corner of the earth all one's lifetime." I believe this is true. I believe that most hate only comes from plain old ignorance. The only way to hate someone is to not know them. I know from history and experience that most everyday people are the same in spite of whatever their government says and does. While it is true that sometimes you meet someone and decide you don't like them, or you hope they don't date your daughter, but hating them is still a stretch.

Near where I went to Junior High school in downtown Rochester, MN, was, a block away, the Mayo Clinic. It was pre-HIPPA and in boredom, I would skip class and go watch the main entrance and lobby at the world-famous Mayo Clinic. There were desks, language desks, where translators were for the people who spoke German, Dutch, French, Spanish, Swedish, Norwegian, Spanish, Portuguese, Hindi, Urdu, Hebrew, Italian, Russian, Polish, Greek, and Swahili. The world came to Mayo and it was amazing and intriguing for me to meet all these fascinating people. So many colors, so many styles, so many languages, so many customs – and all there because they were ill and they were loved. It made my world bigger. It placed any sort of hate or bigotry on unstable ground.

This week the Birkebeiner will bring people from all over the world. It has been my pleasure and honor to speak an invocation at the Worldloppet Breakfast on Birkie Friday for several years now. These are skiers who have or are trying to, ski in five ski marathons throughout the world. I meet people from all over the world. I meet Olympians. They're all beautiful and wonderful.

Many of you know that I lived for a year on the island of New Guinea in the South Pacific. I worked with Americans, Canadians, Finns, Germans, Australians, Norwegians, Polish Catholic Seminary Students, a Belgian Priest, and a few hundred of New Guinea's 1100 tribes. My in-laws were missionaries to Cameroon. My brother-in-law has organized a ministry in Uganda. At college I was friends with students from Malta and Nepal and Senegal. In seminary I met colleagues from Ethiopia and Malawi and Madagascar. I had seminary professors, one an Indian, from India, who was born and raised in French Guiana and another South Korean who was an orphan who worked as a translator for US Troops during the Korean Conflict. And this is just what I remember off the top of my head.

All of these experiences have made for a richer appreciation of the world. I have come to the realization that the reason people hate people they do not know is ignorance, not experience. There will always be sin, and not a single person we meet will be perfect, but neither are we, neither am I. That is what we have in common, not what separates us. And all desire to be loved and accepted – just like me. Just like you.

# Colin "Joe" Laberee

March 25, 1950 ~ January 31, 2024 (age 73)

Colin "Joe" Laberee, age 73, of Cable, WI passed away on Wednesday, January 31, 2024, at Essentia Health-St. Mary's Medical Center in Duluth, MN after respiratory complications following a several year struggle with pulmonary fibrosis.

Colin Richard Laberee was born March 25, 1950, in Glenwood City, WI the son of Richard and Aryles (Stene) Laberee. He was raised on the family farm in Boyceville, WI until early childhood when the family moved to Menomonie, WI. He graduated from Menomonie High School, then briefly attended the University of Wisconsin-Stout. He began his career as a laborer and quickly advanced, traveling throughout Wisconsin before starting at Chequamegon Telephone Company (Norvado), working as a residential engineer for over 30 years before retiring in 2006. He continued to do consulting for Tjader & Highstrom as well as Finley Engineering until 2012.

On June 18, 1983, he was united in marriage to Lorraine Spears at First Lutheran Church in Hayward, WI. Together they built their life in Cable where he enjoyed coffee at the local café, car shows with his Corvette, riding snowmobile, shooing billiards and trap. He was an active member of the community serving the Cable Area Lions Club for over 35 years helping prepare the St. Patty's Day dinner, Fourth of July celebration and delivering Meals on Wheels. Colin and Lori attended First Lutheran Church in Hayward for 41 years where he ushered and served two terms on the church council. He loved helping his brother on the farm with spring fieldwork and fall harvest, he enjoyed fishing trips to Canada, time at the hunting camp and NASCAR races. More than anything, he loved his family, taking several trips across the United States when his children were growing, visiting relatives near and far, annual spring break trips and most of all the delight of his grandkids.

Colin is survived by his wife Lori of 40 years; two children, Rachael of New Glarus, WI, Adam of Cable; three grandchildren, Benjamin, Alice and Annabelle; two brothers, Laverne (Jolene) of Glenwood City, Neil (Kim) of Menomonie; mother-in-law, Willa Spears of Drummond; two sisters-in-law, Glenna Spears of St. Cloud, FL, Kathleen Paulson of Sheboygan; brother-in-law, Wade (Mary Ann) Spears of Drummond; many nieces, nephews, cousins and aunts Janet, Darla, Lorraine and Ellen.

He was preceded in death by his parents; brothers, Paul and Donald; and his father-in-law, Glenn Spears.

A memorial service was held at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, February 10th, 2024, at First Lutheran Church in Hayward with Pastor Joel Bacon officiating. A visitation was held beforehand from 10:00 – 11:00. A time of gathering with family and friends and luncheon followed at the church. A celebration of life will be held at a date to be announced.
